In This Together

'In This Together' is a collaborative artwork created by local artists, children, youth, and families under the guidance of artist and knowledge keeper Jillian Currie. It honors the Indigenous, Inuit, Métis, Cree, Coast Salish, and Anishnaabe peoples living on Katzie and Kwantlen First Nation Territory.

The artwork illustrates a full circle, from land to water to sky to spirit, symbolizing unity across nations and cultures. Each element reflects Indigenous iconography: the Inukshuk for guidance, Métis floral patterns for heritage, Ojibway birds and flowers for growth, Coast Salish wolves and children for family and wisdom, the Orca for connection to water and spirit, and the Sun and Moon for balance and life.

Created in the spirit of reconciliation, this piece represents the commitment of Maple Ridge/Pitt Meadows Community Services to support and stand with Indigenous Peoples. It is a tribute to shared land, shared care, and shared future.







I'm deeply grateful for the kindness and encouragement that reminded me I'm not alone.

Before I joined the group, I was feeling disconnected and unsure of where to find support. But from the very first session, I felt seen and heard. The program gave me the confidence to ask for help and take steps I never thought possible.
